


Right: The earliest known picture of Lincoln, a daguerreotype taken in about 1846 when he was 37. Well-known as a lawyer, Lincoln had served four terms in the Illinois State Legislature. In 1846 he became a Representative from Illinois in the Thirtieth U.S. Congress. He was a Whig and served only one term.
